Conversation starters: What is one thing that really makes you happy? Have you ever considered that one thing as possibly too important?

- I. Idolatry is False Worship so it Flies in the Face of God.
- II. Idolatry is Rooted in the Desire of Your Own Heart so there's No One to Blame but You.
- III. Idolatry is Just a Shallow Substitute for Christ that Always Leave You Thirsty and Looking for More.
- IV. Idolatry Requires a Specific Plan of Action & Repentance Because It'll Never Go Away on its Own.

Sermon Discussion:

- 1. On a scale of 1 (not at all) to 10 (couldn't be better), how would you rate your satisfaction in life right now? Why?
- 2. What do you think the relationship is between our idols and our sense of God's presence in our life?
- 3. Think back on times in your life when you said "I'll be sure to never let that happen to me," or "I definitely want to be a better ______ than that." What good intention(s) have you committed to that could be ascending to the throne of your heart as an idol(s) in your life?
- 4. Who are you tempted to blame for sins and idols in your life? Why?
- 5. What were the circumstances surrounding the last time you experienced inordinate anger, exaggerated pride, or debilitating fear?
- 6. Why do we prefer to live on substitutes that never leave us satisfied?
- 7. Ask God to show you who or what your idols are.
- 8. Pray Psalm 139:23-24 "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

Definition: An idol is anything or anyone that begins to capture your heart, mind, and affections more than God. (consider memorizing it together as a CG, reciting it at meetings)
