Here at Grace Fellowship, "missions" almost always means "a long-term investment of our resources, time, money, and people in order to make disciples of Jesus in another culture."

We put a heavy emphasis on long-term, one-way cross-cultural ministry because we as a church have embraced one big picture motivation for missions.

1) Motivation For Cross-Cultural Ministry

God is worthy to be worshiped by every kind of person He has created.

Revelation 5:1-14

This glimpse into the inevitable end of all things can give us hope and confidence as we engage a hostile world with the gospel of Jesus, but our real motivation comes from the fact that right now—even as we are today—we at Grace Fellowship Church can say with all our hearts:

"Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"

"Worthy are You to take the scroll and to open its seals, for You were slain, and by Your blood You ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation..."

There is a tangible cost to cross-cultural ministry (money, time, materials, energy.) There is also an immaterial cost (relationships, memories, opportunities, emotional and relational loss.)

2) Strategic Goals at Grace Fellowship

- Cultivating National Biblical Counseling Movements
 - Equipping local counselors.
 - Establishing local counseling ministries.
 - Engaging local churches to train national counselors.
- Sending Disciplemakers to the Least-Reached
 - Equipping local disciplemakers.
 - Establishing local sending systems.
 - Encouraging the local churches to engage the least-reached.

The kind of resilience necessary to stay in the places where the Gospel hasn't yet penetrated comes from a combination of a deep commitment to God's Word and a high view of His sovereignty.

3) Fundamental methods

Overlap between local church life and cross-cultural ministry occurs in the 3 fundamental methods that God seems to be using for all ministry here at Grace Fellowship. All three of these methods apply to anyone who attends here, and the church strongly encourages everyone to participate to the highest degree they are able.
